DID YOU KNOW:

- The first A.A. meeting in Pennsylvania was held in Philadelphia on March 6th, 1940.
- 17 people attended and a "Princely Sum" of \$17.50 was collected. (Thought: Are we helping carry the message and gift that was so freely given to us, with our meeting contributions?)
- In **Pittsburgh**, **PA** the first A.A. meeting was held at the Henry Hotel on December 13th, 1940.

- Bill Wilson's father-n-law, *Dr. Clark Burnham*, was born in **Lancaster**, **PA**.
- Bill and Lois traveled by motorcycle from 1925-1927 from Vermont to Florida and up to Canada. In her 09/26/1925 diary entry, Lois wrote "Egypt, PA Delaware Water Gap was a great disappointment. Hot dog stands spoiled every site so we had to camp way down in the Valley." They camped in vegetable fields north of Allentown as well, so Bill could investigate a cement company in nearby Cementon.
- The first **African American Delegate** to the Annual Convention, **Lou R.**, was elected in Area 59 in 1969.
- The founder of the *First Century Christian Fellowship*, which was later known as the *Oxford Group*, Frank Buchman, was born in Pennsburg, PA.
- Ohio has Founders Day and Dr. Bob's house, New York has GSO and Stepping Stones, Vermont has the Wilson House and Bill and Lois' graves <u>BUT</u> we in Pennsylvania have the Oxford Group No sober Rowland Hazzard, no sober Ebby, no sober Ebby, no sober Bill, no sober Bill, no sober Dr. Bob, no sober Bill and Dr. Bob = NO Alcoholics Anonymous.
- **Jim B., from Philadelphia**, was responsible for the phrase "God as I understand him".
- Pennsylvania was the home of "The Saturday Evening Post", a
 popular magazine that introduced the A.A. program nationally
 by printing a story by Jack Alexander, "Alcoholics Anonymous"
 on March 1st 1941.
