

- ✓ Do I let language, religion (or lack of it), race, education, age or other such things interfere with my carrying the message?
- ✓ When someone turns up in AA needing information or help (even if they can't ask for it aloud), does it really matter to me what they do for a living? Where they live? What his domestic arrangements are? Whether they had been to AA before? What their other problems are?
